

GENERAL INFORMATION

THEME: Built on Rock or Sand?

DATE: June 15 - 19, 2025 (Sunday - Thursday)

COST:

- 9 years and up: **\$50**
- 2 years - 8 years: **\$25**
- Under 2 years old: free
- Daily cost: **\$12.50/day** (9-up); **\$6.25/day** (2-8)
- Includes housing and food!
- Financial assistance may be available on a limited basis. We want you to come!
- Children under 9 years old must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

PLACE: Uinta County Youth Camp

(Cabins with bunks and mattresses are supplied. You'll find a road map to camp later in this pamphlet.)

CLASSES

- All campers will be expected to participate in the classes and activities that are held each day.
- The two morning classes will be divided into appropriate age groups, to be determined when registrations are received.
- The keynote address (evening lesson) will be given by our guest speaker or camp staffer.
- Keynote speaker this year: Darrel Yontz who works with the Church of Christ which meets at 1295 Brickyard Rd, Chipley FL
- Fireside devotionals will include singing and a lesson by one of the campers.

EXTRA FOOD

Parents are asked to provide, if it is convenient, a gallon of milk (2%) and a loaf of bread per family. Such donations help to defray food costs. Snacks (cookies\fresh vegetables\fruit) are also appreciated. Refreshment cards may be bought (\$3.00 each) to buy afternoon treats during free time. Thank you.

- 1) This map is not to scale.
- 2) Exit off of I-80 at Exit #39, turn south.
- 3) Continue south through Urie on Highway 414.
- 4) Continue west through Mountain View and take 410 through Robertson.
- 5) Turn south at the end of oiled road onto 271(dirt road continues west).
- 6) Go across cattle guard on unpaved road.
- 7) Travel approximately 12 miles.
- 8) Turn east at sign: "Uinta County Youth Camp."
- 9) Go across bridge, take right fork (left is gated).
- 10) Follow signs to the camp.

FISHING: The Uinta County Youth Camp Fish Preserve (the Pond) is available for our use this year at the cost of \$5/day/person. Special rules apply — for more information please ask.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- *Deadline for applications*, medical consent forms, liability releases, water recreation releases, and payments is June 15, 2025, but the sooner we receive them, the better! **Please make your checks payable to WyoCamp '25**. Check-in for camp will begin at about 2:00 p.m. on Sunday (June 15). We must leave the campsite by 12:00 p.m. on Thursday (June 19). We will meet at a nearby location (Fort Bridger) for lunch on that day.
- **All campers** are expected to participate in certain necessary tasks each day, including cleaning cabins, KP duty, cleaning grounds and cleaning restrooms. On the last morning, all campers are expected to help with clean up and cabin cleaning.
- **WyoCamp '25 is not operated by nor sponsored by any church group or denomination. This camp is organized and operated solely by interested individuals.**

CAMP RULES!

1. NO alcoholic beverages or illicit drugs.
2. NO fireworks of any kind.
3. NO firearms, knives, or other weapons.
4. NO climbing through windows of cabins or on top of cabins.
5. NO pets.
6. NO motor bikes, ATVs, etc.
7. Curfew: 10:00 p.m. (in cabins).
8. Modest attire (knee-length shorts are allowed).
9. If we participate in water recreation, appropriate swim-wear will be acceptable at the lake. NO bikinis.
10. All campers will be expected to participate in ALL group activities.
11. Use of cell phones will not be allowed during classes and group activities. Cell phone use may be restricted further if it becomes too distracting.
12. Each cabin will have a designated supervisor.
13. First aid will be available if necessary.
14. NO ONE may leave the immediate cabin area without permission from the appointed camp staffer.
15. ALL campers will be expected to follow all rules of WyoCamp '25 and the instructions of camp staff. Failure to comply will result in disciplinary action, determined by the camp staff at WyoCamp '25.

BE SURE TO BRING WITH YOU...

1. Your Bible, pen or pencil, paper or notebook.
2. Any personal items you may need: soap, toothbrush and toothpaste. Know where your towel is. Electric outlets and showers are available in the bathrooms.
3. A sleeping bag or sheets and blankets.
4. Warm clothing (enough for the week) and an extra pair of shoes. Dress is casual, slacks or jeans would be appropriate. Knee-length shorts will be allowed. Shirts must be worn always.
